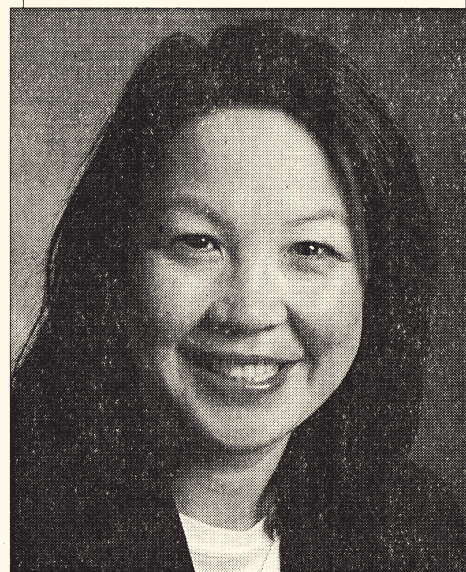

Suzanne Fong goes Grey



The announcement says it all: Suzanne Fong is going Grey but staying true to her Roots. The Vancouver public relations veteran has joined forces with Grey Advertising after running her own firm, Write Ideas, for nearly 15 years. Roots Canada is one of her clients and will retain Fong's services. Fong, who becomes director of public relations for Grey, said all her clients have stayed with her in the move. "There was a little bit of anxiety about it at first but it's going to be wonderful," Fong said. "I went this route because I wanted to have more services I could provide to my clients." By joining Grey Advertising, Fong moves from a five-person operation to one that has a staff of 26, headed by Grey senior vice-president Tim Johnson. The company provides a full range of communications services, including sales promotion, advertising, public relations, production and direct marketing. 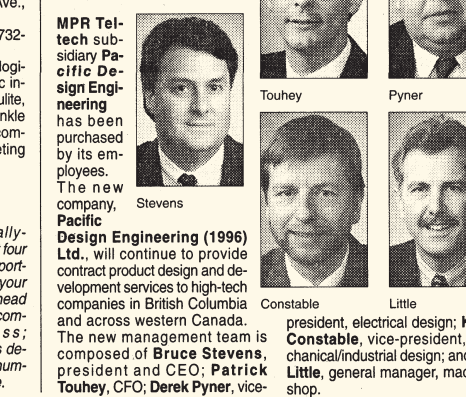
