It promises to be a hub of activity with special features and events, and could become a major tourist attraction for the city, if not for the whole country.

Over 1,500 jobs are expected to be created inside the mall, which by itself is a strong built-in solid customer base. developer, Vancouver's Fairchild Developments Ltd., has had an overwhelmingly positive response from

retailers since its leasing program began four weeks ago.

While there will be lots of activity happening inside the mall, the outside of Aberdeen Centre will sit as a striking addition to the streetscape.

The building's exterior has a unique design of semi-transparent, coloured glass. Award winning glass architect Stephanie Forsythe's design allows only shadows and movement to be seen from the outside, a unique way of showcasing the mall.

The new centre will be a popular tourist destination, drawing visitors from across the country and people from abroad.

Hazelbridge Way has been rerouted to accommodate extra visitors and improve the flow of traffic.

A new street, Browngate Road, will conveniently connect the mall to No. 3 Road.

Malls can save on costs by having only one entrance to the parking lot, but Aberdeen Centre is building two, ensuring a smooth access to the 1.260space parkade.


Visitors will enjoy the convenience of having the choice of entering the three levels of the mall directly from each level of parking.
