So who wields the most power in Vancouver?

Premier Christy Clark, Gordon Fisher, president and publisher of The Province and The Vancouver Sun, and Thomas Fung, CEO of the Fairchild Retail and Media Group, were among the annual Power 50 list announced by Vancouver Magazine on Monday night at the Hotel Vancouver.

Among the movers-andshakers to make the annual list, Clark took top honours — if her landslide win in the May provincial election was any indication.

Other power-brokers

named as having an impact on the city were the Aquilini family, Vancouver police Chief Jim Chu and Suzanne Anton, B.C. minister of justice and attorney general.

In all, leaders in business, education, trade, the arts and yes — even marijuana — were among those named.

Pastwinners include former premier Gordon Campbell, Vancouver Mayor Gregor Robertson and ex-VANOC CEO John Furlong.
