STARRY WEEKEND The Cantonese and Mandarin broadcasting service Fairchild Television celebrated its 22nd anniversary of serving Chinese-Canadians in grand fashion, with an All Star Charity Gala weekend. Vanhattan's A-list arrived en masse at the Point Grey estate home of the firm's CEO and chairman Thomas Fung and his wife Amy for an intimate garden party, before a star-studded gala dinner and concert the following night at the Vancouver Convention Centre.

Guests making the scene included 12 of Hong Kong's top artists and entertainers who travelled to Vancouver for the broadcaster's birthday weekend, which was hosted in collaboration with TVB Hong Kong and Emperor Entertainment Group and benefitted the VGH & UBC Hospital Foundation. Friday night's reception rose to a crescendo with the news of a \$1.2-million gift from Viva Pharmaceutical president CEO Jason Ko and his wife Emily to fund a lung cancer screening pilot program at VGH focused on early detection and treatment.

The following night, a thousand guests gathered for a black-tie gala dinner and another 2,000 adoring fans packed the convention hall for a string of musical acts comprising some of Asia's top talent. They included Hong Kong idols Hins Cheung, Vincy Chan and actress singer Kate Tsui. The all-star lineup also featured some familiar Vancouver faces, including Miss Chinese International Gloria Tang and rising talent Fred Cheng. With the gala and concert generating another \$400,000, he one-off birthday weekend celebrations gifted Vancouver General Hospital a healthy \$1.6 million.
