Some \$750,000 from Gerald and Sheahan McGavin's million-dollar donation to the Vancouver Arts Stabilization Trust helped the VSO in 1996. Further dire fiscal difficulties were eased in 2002 when \$500,000 from board chair Art Willms' inspired others to "invest," too. Through that period and until his 2018 retirement, 18-year music director Bramwell Tovey and musicians solidified the VSO's domestic and global reputation. Seeking a smooth future, Willms and Vancouver Symphony Society chair Fred Withers co-chair a \$30-million anniversary fundraising campaign.
